#### DEFINITION

- English -> similar to dative case
- Use -> divided into 2 groups
  - According to the rules
  - Depends on its unique logic

## FEATURES

- Affix -> attached to the root of the word
- 2 groups

-a / -ä	-ta / -tä	
<ul><li>multi-syllable word</li><li>Ends with a vowel</li></ul>	- Base of the word -> ends with a vowel	
Minulla on koira- <b>a</b> . I have dog-PART 'I have a dog.'	Juon olut- <b>ta</b> . drink.1sg beer-PART 'I drink beer.'	
Näen talo- <b>a</b> . see.1sg house-PART 'I have a dog.'	Syön suklaa- <b>ta</b> . eat.1sg chocolate-PART 'I eat chocolate.'	

## THE USE OF PARTITIVUS

According to the rules

Use	Example		
After numbers	two dogs-part seve	emän talo- <b>a</b> n houses-PART en houses'	
Greetings, formal expressions	Hyvää yö-tä! good-PART night-PART 'Good night!'	Paljon onne- <b>a!</b> a.lot.of luck-PART 'Good luck!'	
After certain verbs	soitan kitara-a play.1SG guitar-PART 'I play the guitar.'	rakastan sinu- <b>a</b> love.1SG you-PART 'I love you.'	

## THE USE OF PARTITIVUS

Use	Example		
Uncountable nouns	Syön liha-a. Ostan voi-ta. eat.1sg meat-PART buy.1sg butter-PART 'I eat meat.' 'I buy butter.'		
Negative sentences	Minulla <u>ei ole</u> koira- <b>a</b> .  I have is not-3SG dog-PART  'I don't have a dog.'		
	Sinä et syö omena- <b>a</b> .  You not eat-2SG apple-PART  'You are not eating an apple.'		

# THE USE OF PARTITIVUS

According to logical thinking

Use	Example		
Have not done an action	Syön omena-a. Luen kirja-a. eat.1SG apple-PART read.1SG book-PART 'I am eating an apple.' 'I am reading a book.'		
Do not know anything about the subject	Pihalla on koira-a. in the yard be.3SG dog-PART 'There's a dog in the yard.'		
Talking in general	Haluaisin koira-a. want.1SG COND dog-PART 'I want a dog.'		

#### PLURALFORM

- Monikko Partitiivi
- 2 options

b	ase+t	base+i+i	nflection
- Cannot be inflected		<ul> <li>Base of the word -&gt; ends with a vowel</li> <li>can be inflected</li> </ul>	
talo- <b>t</b> house-pl.noм 'houses'	ihmise- <b>t</b> person-pl.noм 'people'	talo-ja (talo+i+a) house-pl.part 'houses'	ihmisi <b>ä</b> person-pl.part 'people'
